**SUSTAINABILITY ADVISORY BOARD**

**PUBLIC COMMENTS: (Non-agenda items only)**

1. Ms. Chanda Begin introduced questions about homeowners' associations (HOA) in Palm Bay. She wanted more information regarding policies that may or may not support utilizing sustainable measures in landscaping, such as rain barrels, composting, non-turf grass yards, and use of native plants.

**ADOPTION OF MINUTES:**

**1. Regular Meeting 2023-03; March 22, 2023**

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

### **1. Sustainability Fair discussion and overall outcome**

Mr. Snyder requested wish lists from each board member for upcoming fairs. The Board concurred to have matching attire, such as t-shirts, to be easily recognized at the fair. Also, having workshops and tents for the Utilities Department and Republic Services were favorable and would be requested in the future. Future improvements included obtaining more food trucks, better garbage and recycling control and/or attempting to be a zero-waste event and striving to have more focus on vendors that had clear links to sustainability.

The Board discussed having a raffle at next year's event, forming a sub-committee, and beginning planning stages sooner for the event. Board members provided some new ideas for workshops and demonstrations.

### **2. Native plant demo garden update**

Ms. Higgins noted that the Conradina Chapter of the Florida Native Plant Society was interested in providing fundraising assistance for the garden. She said the group needed more information before making a decision to proceed. Ms. Sherman advised that a follow up meeting with city staff would be needed.

### **3. New goal(s) for board to pursue**

Mr. Snyder asked each board member to present a topic of interest. Members agreed on trying to establish a composting program within the city. Comments included educating and following up on HOA's in Palm Bay with regard to their rules and regulations.

## **OTHER BUSINESS:**

### **1. Upcoming meetings/events of interest (INFORMATIONAL)**

Ms. Higgins and Ms. Connolly advised of a forum hosted by Little Grower's Inc. A reminder was given about the Brevard Working Sustainable Group that met on the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of every month. Board members mentioned a meeting regarding the Malabar Scrub Jay Sanctuary that would take place Monday, May 1<sup>st</sup>, at the First Baptist Church of Malabar.
