Last month, Palm Bay Fire Rescue responded to a sizable number of brush fires. Hundreds of acres burned in April, causing PBFR to stretch its resources to mitigate all the fires, while still providing first response coverage to the rest of the city. During these fires, we called upon several agencies to aid us in our fight against these blazes. The estimated property value that was in jeopardy during these fires exceeded 8 million dollars. We are happy to report that there was no loss of life, no homes lost, and no injuries, with the estimated property damage to be less than \$100,000.



Last month, Palm Bay Fire Rescue brought on 12 new hires, to start their journey with our department. The new hire process will be 8 long weeks of orientation that will include a myriad of different training topics and objectives. The recruit class is being managed by our brand new, and fully functioning Training Division. Battalion Chief Lamb, Lieutenant Bliss, Driver Engineer Hanstein, and Fire Medic Almeida have been putting in the long hours to make sure this new hire class is the best we've fostered in years. The goal is to give these 12 men an academy style class that incorporates physical fitness and agility evaluations, fireground operations, hose deployment, forcible entry and most importantly, teamwork. We are very excited and fortunate, to have them aboard!
