RE: Ordinance 2025-06, amending the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 budget by

appropriating and allocating certain monies (first budget amendment), final

reading.

SUMMARY:

A public hearing is to be held on the above subject ordinance and the caption read for the second and final time at tonight's Council meeting.

This quarterly Budget Amendment accounts for all budget adjustments completed in the first quarter of the fiscal year resulting in an increase/decrease to individual fund and/or departmental budgets. The following adjustments are listed below: recognition of grant revenues with associated planned expenditures; quarterly City Council approved unbudgeted requests; budget corrections to reverse scrivener errors; and re-appropriations of previously City Council approved unbudgeted requests from Fiscal Year 2023-2024 that were not spent in that given period and were not included in the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Approved Budget.

ORDINANCE 2025-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2025 BUDGET BY APPROPRIATING AND ALLOCATING FUNDS IDENTIFIED IN EXHIBIT 'A', CONSISTING OF FOUR (4) PAGES AND INCORPORATED IN ITS ENTIRETY HEREIN; RECOGNIZING THAT SUCH APPROPRIATIONS MUST BE MADE PURSUANT TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY, CHAPTER 35, FINANCE; ADOPTING, RATIFYING, CONFIRMING, AND VALIDATING THE ALLOCATIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Palm Bay recognizes that non-budgeted items must be appropriated and that such appropriation must be allocated by Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, transfers between funds and departments must be approved by City Council, and

WHEREAS, Chapter 35, Finance (former "Budget, Section 35.035"), of the City of Palm Bay Code of Ordinances, provides for the transfer of funds and appropriation of unbudgeted funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY

OF PALM BAY, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, as follows:

SECTION 1. The City Council, in accordance with the City of Palm Bay Code of Ordinances, Chapter 35, Finance (former "Budget, Section 35.035"), hereby appropriates the funds as identified in Exhibit 'A'.

SECTION 2. The City Council adopts, ratifies, and approves the appropriations as identified in Exhibit 'A'.

SECTION 3. The provisions within this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the enactment date.
