GOVERNANCE & ORGANIZATION

The Mayor and four City Council members are elected at large to serve four-year terms. The City Manager, appointed by the Council, leads day-to-day operations and oversees essential municipal services, including:

- Public Works infrastructure, roads, and stormwater management
- Utilities water, wastewater, and environmental services
- Public Safety police, fire rescue, and emergency management
